On motion by Louis Hatcher, second by Frank Griffin, the Board unanimously approved the modification of the charter resolution provided by GSBA. The Board deleted the following paragraph. *"Whereas , the Lee County Board of Education strongly supports the development of well-planned and welladministered charter schools under the constitutional control and management of the locally elected board."* On motion by Robert Clay, second by Frank Griffin, the Board approved the modified version of the Charter Resolution. The Resolution will be sent to GSBA and local legislators. **WHEREAS,** the Lee County Board of Education accepts its constitutional responsibility as the elected representatives of the citizens of the School District to manage and control the public schools of the District;

**WHEREAS,** the Lee County Board of Education believes that it violates the Georgia Constitution for the General Assembly to delegate the management and control of local public schools to any body other than the properly elected local board of education;

**WHEREAS,** the Lee County Board of Education believes that it is unconstitutional for the General Assembly to delegate to a state appointed body the authority to create a separate system of public schools throughout the State;

**WHEREAS,** the Lee County Board of Education believes it unconstitutional in the absence of approval by the locally elected board of education or the people in a referendum specifically called for that purpose, for the State to take local school tax dollars for the purpose of funding a commission charter school;

**WHEREAS,** the Lee County Board of Education believes that the development of a separate and distinct funding system for the calculation of a local funding share to be taken away from the funds provided for the education of students in local school districts and provided instead to charter commission schools is unconstitutional, inequitable and threatens the integrity of the existing statewide system for funding public education;

**WHEREAS,** the Georgia Charter Schools Commission has created two commission charter schools, whose charters were carefully reviewed and not approved by the local elected boards of education in the counties in which they are located, who are not under the control and management of the local board of education, but were instead created solely by the appointed Charter Schools Commission and are now receiving a share of local revenue from the taxpayers of those school districts with a student who is a resident of the school district attending the charter commission school;

**WHEREAS,** the Georgia Charter School Commission has 34 petitions from other proposed commission charter schools throughout the State presently pending for approval;

**NOW THEREFORE,** be it resolved that the Lee County Board of Education states support of those locally elected boards of education that have been required to go to court in an effort to stop this unconstitutional usurpation of power and local tax funds, and its continued commitment to the constitutional

doctrine of control and management of local public schools and local public school tax dollars by elected local boards of education.

Adopted this 14<sup>th</sup> day of December, 2009.

On motion by Greg Duke, second by Frank Griffin, the Board unanimously approved a request to pilot a centralized registration process. Dr. Walters will update the Board at the May or June meeting regarding this new initiative.

The Board recognized art work from Lee County Elementary School.

On motion by Louis Hatcher to consider a matter involving the disclosure of personally identifiable information from a student's educational records and to discuss the future acquisition of real estate, second by Frank Griffin the Board unanimously approved to enter executive session. Board Members voting to enter executive session were Robert Clay, Greg Duke, Frank Griffin, Louis Hatcher and Sylvia Vann.

On motion by Frank Griffin, second by Louis Hatcher the Board unanimously voted to re-open the meeting.
