### 2.A.9 Item 4

GSBA urges the enactment of legislation to substantially reduce the amount of preferential tax treatment afforded large timber tracts under the Forest Land Protection Act.

### Rational:

After a successful public relations campaign by big timber interests and under the guise of protecting Georgia's forests, a constitutional amendment was ratified in 2008 giving preferential tax treatment to owners of large timber tracts. The amendment also provided grants to local school boards and county governments to partially compensate for the resulting loss of property tax revenue. This had the effect of shifting property taxes from large timber interests to those who pay taxes on homes, cars, businesses and family size farms and to those who pay state sales and income taxes. At a time of budget crisis, with homeowners losing their special tax exemption, state employees and teachers being furloughed, vital services being curtailed and unemployment over ten-percent, big timber interests get thirty to sixtypercent tax savings. The constitutional amendment is with us for the foreseeable future. However, the legislature has the authority to substantially reduce the amount of preferential treatment afforded under this amendment.

All proposed legislative positions will be presented to the GSBA Governmental Operations Committee (GOC) members at its meeting May 3, 2010 meeting. The GOC will consider proposals in finalizing its report and will make recommendations to the GSBA Delegate Assembly. Delegates will vote on the GOC's report during the business meeting of the Delegate Assembly on Friday, June 11, 2010, in Savannah, Georgia. GEORGIA LEE COUNTY April 13, 2010
