- 1. Summer school for grades 6-8 will be held at Lee County Middle School from 8:00-3:00 during the month of June for a two week period of time.
- 2. Students must pay \$175.00 to attend summer school.
- 3. Summer school is limited to students who attended LCMS during the previous school year.
- 4. Summer school is for promotion purposes.
- 5. A student may take up to two subjects in summer school.
- 6. The grade for the summer school course will be based on the work done in summer school. If the student passes all courses in summer school that need to be taken to be promoted, he/she will be promoted. A separate grade for the course taken in summer school will be noted on a transcript.
- 7. If a student fails three or more subjects, the student may not attend summer school. (Student must repeat the grade failed.)
- 8. Progress reports will be sent at the end of the first week.
- 9. The LCSS Code of Conduct and dress code will be strictly enforced.
- 10. Transportation to and from summer school is the responsibility of the student's parent/guardian. If bus transportation is needed, a form will be provided in advance of the end of school for the parent to complete.

11. Attendance is required for successful completion of summer school. Students may not miss more than two school days.
