Mr. Canterbury would like to proceed with the purchase of the two 90 passenger school buses if the bids are within \$50,000 of the state funding for two 72 passenger buses. The buses have to be built and he would like to ensure their delivery by the time school begins in August.

Dr. Clay asked Franklin Rash if he had costs associated with compressor breakdowns during August. Mr. Rash said he would obtain that information.
