He voiced concern about denying students/teachers a full instructional year as well as not providing employee raises.

On motion by Robert Clay, second by Claire Lang, the Board unanimously approved the 2013-2014 salary guide.

On motion by Louis Hatcher to discuss or deliberate upon the appointment, employment, compensation, hiring, disciplinary action or dismissal, or periodic evaluation or rating of a public officer or employee or to interview applicants for the position of superintendent, second by Robert Clay the Board unanimously approved to enter executive session. Board Members voting to enter executive session were Robert Clay, Frank Griffin, Louis Hatcher, Claire Lang and Sylvia Vann.
