

Criminal Investigation **Text:** Forensic Science for High School

Course Description: This is the third and final course in the Law and Justice curriculum of the Public Safety pathway. It focuses on the criminal investigative process and the forensic examination of evidence. Students will see photos and videos dealing with subject matter of a somewhat graphic nature. All such material has been approved by the LCHS administration. Your signature indicates your approval for your child to participate in all aspects of this class.

Instructional Philosophy: Students will have an opportunity thru this course to gain an understanding of their interest in pursuing a career in the Public Safety area. Students will be expected to demonstrate technical literacy (read, write and comprehend the language of the field), and numerical literacy (understand and perform math concepts that are relative to the field). Professionals in the public safety field will be invited to talk with the class.

Course Goals: To introduce students to crime scene investigation and the nature of forensic examination of evidence at a crime scene and in laboratory conditions in order to provide usable evidence and testimony in a trial. They will learn to secure and process a crime scene, prepare written reports following proper protocols, draw conclusions about a crime based on the evidence they collected, and be able to testify at a trial about their findings. Students will also learn about the aspects of organized crime, criminal profiling, cyber crime, and serial crimes.

Grading Scale:

- A - 90 & above (Outstanding quality of work presented on time)
- B - 80-89 (Above average quality of work presented on time)
- C - 70-79 (Average quality of work presented on time)
- F - < 70 (Poor quality of work and late work)

Assignments: Students will have tests, midterm assessments, conduct labs, and have quizzes and class work assignments, and projects. As part of the curriculum for this class, students will be reading and discussing one or more various Sherlock Holmes or Agatha Christie novels. All novels deal with the criminal justice system, are appropriate for the curriculum, and follow Lee County BOE policy. Should you have some objection to your student reading the assigned novel, please contact me so that we may discuss an alternate assignment.

Assessment Plan:

35%-class work /homework/labs/ quizzes

40%-tests

25%-projects

Late Work Policy: Up to a 50% reduction in grade; Any work over 3 days late that has not been approved by me for later submission may receive a 0.

Class Expectations: Students will come to class **on time** with their notebook, textbook and any other necessary material EVERY DAY! Materials: They may use a three ring binder with other subjects in it as long as they use dividers so that my class has its own section in the binder. They may use pencils, blue, black (preferred), green, or purple ink. *Any work done in red will not be counted.* Work done in any other color may not be counted.

End of Pathway Assessment: Students completing all three courses in the pathway will take this exam **second** semester. It will count as an exam **and can not be exempted.**

SkillsUSA is co-curricular with this class. It provides students with opportunities to compete in skill competitions tied to what they learn in the Law and Justice program. There is a cost to join and participation is **OPTIONAL**. Students going to competition must meet eligibility requirements and pay the ***nonrefundable*** fees for the trip. They may offset the cost by participating in fundraisers. If a student is disqualified from competition due to grades or behavior, or withdraws, the money paid is **forfeited.**
