**Prerequisite:** *Early Childhood Education I*

Early Childhood Education II is designed to prepare students for employment in early childhood education care and education services. The course provides a history of education, licensing and accreditation requirements, and foundations of basic observation practices and applications. Early childhood care, education, and development issues are also addressed and include health, safety, and nutrition education; certification in CPR/First Aid/Fire Safety; information about child abuse and neglect; symptoms and prevention of major childhood illnesses and diseases; and prevention control of communicable illnesses.

Mastery of standards through project based learning, laboratory application, technical skills practice, and leadership development activities will provide students with a competitive edge for entry into the marketplace and/or a post-secondary institution.

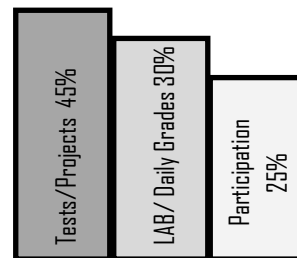
**1st Offense** –Verbal Warning
